From the Desk of Father Jonathan

What a wonderful week of celebrations of the life of St. Anthony of Padua and of our parish.

As we were preparing for the illumination of the exterior and the ringing of the refurbished bells, I was reminded of what Msgr. Burke, our first pastor, envisioned this church to be. The year was 1916, one hundred years ago. The basement church (Fatima Hall) was no longer big enough for the growing parish. This is how a parish historian described his vision for the new church:

"The beloved Msgr. Burke, of happy memory, determined to build in honor of the Blessed Mother of God, a church most majestic. It would be one wherein it would only be necessary to enter the door to have one's thoughts directed heavenward. It would be a sanctuary and a home for the souls of Mt. Carmel Parish, where they could go and kneel in peace and pray, where they could forget the cares and troubles and trials of life."

His vision was realized.

One hundred years later, we can celebrate another small milestone. Due to the generosity of so many of you, and people from outside this neighborhood too, our beloved church has been fortified and beautified in its external structure. We have more work to do, including the refurbishing of the organ, new central flooring, painting of the sanctuary, and more. But we are on our way, as we move toward the 100th anniversary of the first mass in this church, celebrated on September 2nd, 1917 by Msgr. Caffuzzi.

Church structures only matter if they draw us closer to God. I have every confidence that this is what is happening to you and to me.

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD**Sunday Gospel: Luke 7, 36-50**

The Pharisees and Sadducees were major sects of Judaism. The elite priestly Sadducees disappeared after the destruction of the Jerusalem temple. The Pharisees took Judaism from temple worship to synagogue assembly. The Gospels portray them as opponents of Jesus, but today's Gospel tells how Jesus is invited to a Pharisee's house to eat. An unnamed woman arrives, washes Jesus' feet with her tears, dries them with her hair, and anoints him with oil. Only prostitutes had unbound hair, so Jesus' Pharisee friend condemns her as a sinner. Jesus says his host has not provided the ordinary gestures of hospitality—washing and anointing before a meal—but this unnamed woman has. In Jesus' time people thought sinfulness caused illness.

Maybe the woman was a prostitute, or perhaps she was mentally ill or simply proud and critical. Regardless, Jesus is aware—as the Pharisee is not—that she knows her brokenness and trusts God to heal her.

Living Stewardship Now

Pray for people you know who are sick, mentally ill, or in the grip of an addiction, that God will give them the healing they need in body, mind, or spirit.

RIFLESSIONE SULLA PAROLA DI DIO**Vangelo della Domenica: Luca 7, 36-50**

Gesù è stato accusato di essere amico dei peccatori. Ebbene sì, vuole esserlo. Ma in che senso? Il Vangelo di oggi lo spiega. In quei tempi era costume che si invitassero i maestri itineranti. Prima del pasto, erano obbligatori alcuni gesti di ospitalità come, ad esempio, offrire dell'acqua e salutare con un abbraccio. Ecco che una donna, conosciuta come peccatrice, mostra nei confronti di Gesù un'ospitalità eccessiva, mentre Simone non è certo prodigo in gesti. Di fronte alla sua perplessità, Gesù racconta una parabola sul perdono. La donna si converte, piange lacrime di contrizione e di ringraziamento. Gesù dichiara: "Le sono perdonati i suoi molti peccati, poiché ha molto amato". Gesù la conferma nella sua fede: davanti agli occhi di tutti riconcilia la peccatrice con Dio e la reintegra nella società degli uomini onesti. Abbiamo, dunque, qui l'esempio della contrizione perfetta. Il confessore ripete nella formula dell'assoluzione le parole che nell'epilogo Gesù rivolge a questa donna. Gesù era un infaticabile viaggiatore che annunciava il vangelo. Lo accompagnavano non solo i discepoli, ma anche le donne. Egli le ha associate alla sua attività apostolica, ha accettato il loro servizio e il loro aiuto materiale, comportandosi così in modo rivoluzionario per quell'epoca. Gesù restituisce pienamente alla donna la sua dignità di essere umano: agli occhi di Dio è pari

REFLEXIONEMOS LA PALABRA DE DIOS

Evangelio del Domingo: Lucas 7, 36-50

Los fariseos y saduceos eran sectas principales del judaísmo. La elite sacerdotal de los saduceos desapareció después de la destrucción del templo de Jerusalén. Los fariseos sacaron al judaísmo del templo y lo llevaron a las asambleas de las sinagogas. Los evangelios los representan como oponentes de Jesús, pero el evangelio de hoy nos dice que un fariseo invitó a Jesús a comer en su casa. Una mujer, cuyo nombre desconocemos, lava con sus lágrimas los pies de Jesús, los enjuga con su cabellera y los unge con perfume. Sólo las prostitutas usaban el pelo suelto, por eso el fariseo amigo de Jesús la condena como a una pecadora. Jesús dice que su anfitrión no le ha ofrecido los gestos comunes de hospitalidad—lavado y unción antes de una comida—pero esta mujer sí lo ha hecho. En la época de Jesús la gente creía que el pecado era causa de la enfermedad. Tal vez la mujer era una prostituta o tenía una enfermedad mental, o quizás era orgullosa y crítica. Por encima de todo, Jesús se da cuenta—mientras que el fariseo no se la da—de que ella reconoce su propio quebranto y confía en que Dios puede sanarla.

Viviendo la Palabra de Dios

Reza por personas que conozcas con alguna enfermedad, ya sea física o mental, o que están atrapadas por una adicción. Pídele a Dios que las sane de cuerpo, mente y espíritu.
