This week I thought I would share with you a story of someone I met in the neighborhood a few weeks back. I have changed her name to protect her privacy. She has given me permission to write this:

The call came in to the rectory late at night. I let it go to voice mail. Since there was nobody else on duty for emergency calls, I would need to listen to the message immediately. I knew most likely it was just someone who couldn't sleep and figured they would call the church and leave a message for the pastor.

It was a woman's voice, endearingly earnest, yet calm, shy, honest, and understated.

"This message is for Fr. Jonathan", she began quietly. "My name is Theresa. I'm so sorry for calling so late, and I hope this isn't waking you up. I didn't have the nerve to call you during the day. You don't know me, but I see you in the neighborhood and in front of your church. I'm not really religious, and to be honest, I've never been inside a church, so I don't know if I'm the type of person you would meet with."

The message went on and she described why she was calling and the problems she was going through.

Theresa didn't leave her phone number, but she approached me on the street a few days later. We had a wonderful first meeting and she has begun to attend mass on a regular basis.

I tell you her story because it was another member of our parish--one of you--who suggested to Theresa that she reach out to me. She is beginning a new friendship with Jesus because one of you cared enough to care for her.

We are called to be the hands and feet of Jesus! Thank you for being so good.

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD**Sunday Gospel: Luke 18, 9-14**

In today's familiar story of the Pharisee and tax-collector, the two are praying near each other in the temple. The Pharisee thanks God for making him better than other people, including the man standing nearby. Tax collectors were hated because they colluded in collecting the Roman Empire's taxes and usually exacted extra for themselves. The Pharisee feels entitled to lump the tax collector together with all evildoers. But outward appearances do not reveal what is in the heart. In Jesus' story, the tax collector makes no comparisons between himself and others.

Aware only of his sins and failings, he silently bows his head and begs God's mercy. In conversation and thought, how often do we compare ourselves to other people? It is a natural to say, "Where do I fit in?" around others, but always to frame it in terms of superiority or inferiority is not Jesus' way, nor should it be ours.

RIFLESSIONE SULLA PAROLA DI DIO**Vangelo della Domenica: Luca 18, 9-14**

La parola del Signore che ci invitava, domenica scorsa, a perseverare nella preghiera - Dio ascolterà coloro che perseverano nella loro preghiera - risuona ancora alle nostre orecchie mentre il testo evangelico di oggi completa l'insegnamento sulla preghiera: bisogna certamente pregare, e pregare con insistenza. Ma questo non basta, bisogna pregare sempre di più. E il primo ornamento della preghiera è la qualità dell'umiltà: essere convinti della propria povertà, della propria imperfezione e indegnità. Dio, come ci ricorda la lettura del Siracide, ascolta la preghiera del povero, soprattutto del povero di spirito, cioè di colui che sa e si dichiara senza qualità, come il pubblicano della parabola. La preghiera del pubblicano, che Gesù approva, non parte dai suoi meriti, né dalla sua perfezione (di cui nega l'esistenza), ma dalla giustizia salvatrice di Dio, che, nel suo amore, può compensare la mancanza di meriti personali: ed è questa giustizia divina che ottiene al pubblicano, senza meriti all'attivo, di rientrare a casa "diventato giusto", "giustificato".

Pope Francis proclaimed 7 New Saints**José Sánchez del Río, Martyr**

José died defending the Catholic faith in Mexico for the love of Christ the King and Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Salomone Leclercq, Martyr

He, too, chose to die in the defense of his faith during the French Revolution.

Lodovico Pavoni

An Italian priest who paid close attention to the needs of young men and was concerned with their education. He established - in 1825 - his own religious congregation: the Sons of Mary Immaculate.

Cura Brochero (José Gabriel del Rosario Brochero)

An Argentinean priest 'who smelt of sheep' and travelled enormous distances on the back of a mule during the 19th century to bring consolation and Jesus' message of salvation to the poorest of the poor.

Manuel González García

Founder of the Congregation of the Eucharistic Missionaries of Nazareth. He was known for his strong devotion to the Eucharist and became known as the "Bishop of the Tabernacle". He died in 1940.

Alfonso Maria Fusco

An Italian priest, founder of the Congregation of the Sisters of Saint John the Baptist with a mission is to evangelize, educate and promote youth, especially the most poor, abandoned and at risk. He was close to the neglected farmers in Southern Italy after its unification in 1861.

Elizabeth of the Trinity

Devoted to the Trinity, even though her death was painful, Elizabeth gratefully accepted her suffering as a gift from God. Her last words were: "I am going to Light, to Love, to Life!"

REFLEXIONEMOS LA PALABRA DE DIOS
Evangelio del Domingo: Lucas 18, 9-14

En la historia tan familiar de hoy sobre el fariseo y el publicano, se encuentran los dos rezando en el templo cerca uno del otro. El fariseo le da gracias a Dios por ser mejor que los demás, incluso mejor que el hombre que tiene cerca. Los publicanos o cobradores de impuestos eran despreciados por hacerse cómplices en los cobros de impuestos para el imperio romano y porque normalmente sacaban algo adicional para ellos mismos. El fariseo se siente con derecho a poner al publicano en la lista de todos los pecadores. Pero las apariencias engañan y no revelan lo que está en el corazón. En este relato de Jesús el publicano no se compara con otras personas. Cons-ciente sólo de sus pecados y fracasos, permanece en silencio y cabizbajo para suplicar la misericordia de Dios. ¿Cuán a menudo nos comparamos con otras personas? No en la oración, pero probablemente durante una conversación ordinaria o en nuestro interior.

Al encontrarnos entre otras personas es natural preguntarnos “¿cuál es mi lugar aquí?”; pero hacernos esa pregunta en términos de superioridad o inferioridad no es lo que desea Jesús y por tanto no debe ser ésa nuestra actitud.
