Peaceful Silence.....

Holy Silence.....

We are one week away from Christmas. The stores will double their noisy efforts to sell their Christmas wares. With all this glitz, action, and pressure, the only way for us to prepare room in the Inn for Baby Jesus is to make a concerted effort to practice some Holy Silence.

We create it by quieting the soul, by ordering the mind, by centering our will in His. Holy silence allows us to listen to and embrace the gentle breezes of the Holy Spirit who communicates to us with grace and truth.

Each of you will know what is the best time of your day to create Holy Silence. My best Holy Silence happens very early in the morning. *I usually wake at about 5:30am and I make a cup of coffee.* In the hour or so before I need to take my puppy for a walk and get on with the day, there is peace. I have no interruptions. If I am not careful, these first hours of my day can become a time filled with thinking and planning. That's not bad, but it is NOT Holy Silence. Holy Silence is peaceful listening.

It takes a decision of the will to put aside our anxieties and create within our minds and hearts a sacred space where we are listening to God. During our listening we can turn over to God every difficult situation in our lives and tell him that we will trust him.

Let's make this last week of Advent a place of Holy Silence. Let me know how it goes!

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD**Sunday Gospel: Matthew 1: 18-24**

Matthew's Gospel today tells us Joseph was betrothed to Mary. Unlike engagement, betrothal was a binding contract. The couple might wait for a year before beginning married life. Sexual activity during the betrothal was frowned upon. If the bride became pregnant by another man, her groom could denounce her, and she would be stoned to death. The alternative was quiet divorce. This would have saved Joseph from humiliation, but would have done nothing to protect Mary. God spoke in Joseph's dream and told him to take Mary as his wife. God named her child Jesus—the one who saves.

Joseph took a risk and said "Yes" to God, without regard for the outcome. Not all women have a "just man" like Joseph to stand by them during pregnancy and birth, or the resources to cope with single motherhood or a child with disabilities. Take a risk like Joseph and commit to offering help.

RIFLESSIONE SULLA PAROLA DI DIO**Vangelo della Domenica: Mateo 1, 18-24**

Il Vangelo secondo san Matteo comincia con la "genealogia di Gesù Cristo" (Mt 1,1-17). L'evangelista sottolinea così che la storia che Dio ha cominciato con Abramo ha ora raggiunto il suo obiettivo in Gesù Cristo. L'obiettivo non è la fine della storia, poiché essa continua, ma in modo nuovo. Ci mostra fino a che punto questa storia sia nuova il brano del vangelo di oggi che parla della "nascita di Gesù Cristo". San Matteo usa qui questa parola, che può significare tutto: genesi, origine, fonte, esistenza, divenire. Il rinnovamento completo si prepara già al versetto 16, in cui si dice: "Giuseppe, lo sposo di Maria, dalla quale è nato Gesù". È dunque chiaro che san Matteo vuol dire che Giuseppe non era che il padre adottivo di Gesù.

Ma chi è il vero padre di Gesù? È una domanda che si pone anche Giuseppe nel nostro testo di oggi. E la risposta è assolutamente chiara: è "per opera dello Spirito Santo" che Maria aspetta un bambino. Ma il testo esprime senza dubbio ancora qualcosa di più. Non è perché è stato generato in questo modo straordinario che Gesù è l'obiettivo della storia di Israele e il fondamento di una nuova comunità; si tratta piuttosto di capire che in Gesù Dio si è unito con noi uomini, come rimedio estremo e per sempre. E ciò per liberarci dalla fatalità della colpa del peccato. Ecco perché il figlio di Maria deve portare il nome di Gesù, cioè: "Il Signore salva", ed ecco perché noi possiamo anche chiamare Gesù Emanuele, che si traduce "Dio è con noi". È il messaggio con il quale Matteo inizia il suo Vangelo.

Il Santo Silenzio

Come ha scritto Padre Jonathan, questa settimana cerchiamo di stare un po' nella presenza di Dio, nel Suo grande e santo silenzio, preparandoci nel modo migliore per il Santo Natale. Chiediamo a S. Giuseppe e alla Madonna di accompagnarci nel cammino del silenzio per portare Gesù' al mondo.

Evangelio del Domingo: Mateo 1, 18-24

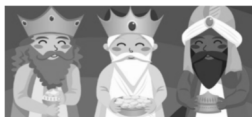
El Evangelio de Mateo nos dice hoy que José estaba desposado con María. A diferencia del compromiso, los esponsales tenían toda la validez de un contrato. La pareja podía esperar hasta un año antes de comenzar su vida matrimonial. La actividad sexual durante este período no se veía bien. Si la novia quedaba encinta por otro hombre, el novio podía denunciarla y a ella la podían matar a pedradas. La alternativa era un divorcio callado. Esto le hubiera evitado una humillación a José, pero en nada hubiera protegido a María. Dios le habló a José en sueños y le dijo que recibiera a María como esposa. Al hijo de María Dios le puso por nombre Jesús, que quiere decir “Dios salva”. José se arriesgó al decirle “sí” a Dios, sin considerar las consecuencias.

No todas las mujeres tienen un “hombre justo” como José que permanezca junto a ellas durante el embarazo y a la hora de dar a luz, ni tampoco tienen los recursos para hacerle frente a una maternidad siendo solteras o a un niño con discapacidades. Arriésgate como José y comprométete a prestar alguna ayuda.
