From the Desk of Father Jonathan

You know how much I love living and serving in this parish, but there is one aspect of life in Belmont with which I have not grown comfortable....the amount of garbage (and other things!) on our streets and sidewalks. Maybe it is something I just need to get used to as part of living in close quarters with so many people in large apartment buildings. But maybe there are things we can do as residents to make things better.

As a parish we are spending significant resources to keep our properties spotless clean. This includes picking up garbage first thing in the morning on all of our sidewalks, and power-washing them at least once a week. We have purchased a machine to help us with the deep cleaning that is needed with so much daily traffic. We are also giving priority to cleanliness inside the church and in Fatima Hall. I know many other merchants and landowners are doing the same. It's a constant challenge to stay ahead of the dirt.

I think cleanliness is not just pleasant, it is also good for the human soul. You have heard the saying, "cleanliness is next to Godliness". Yes, it is easier for us to connect with God when things around us are clean and in their proper place. Have you noticed that when we do a Spring cleaning of our apartments, for example, or just spend a morning cleaning out our closets or ordering our things, that we feel better about life in general? I know I do.

The other day I saw a man stop and pick up a plastic bag on the street and throw it in the trash can. A small gesture, but one that encouraged me to write this column. If we all go the extra mile to encourage cleanliness in our buildings and in our streets, we can make Belmont an even better place to live and to encounter God!

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD**Sunday Gospel: Luke 17, 11-19**

In today's readings lepers are cured: one through the prophet Elisha and ten by Jesus. For centuries lepers were total outcasts, compelled to live apart with other sufferers. Death did not come quickly to lepers, and loneliness and hunger were often worse than the disease. They survived by begging. Imagine the joy of these sufferers who are suddenly made well, and who can now slip back into normal life. Only two of these lepers paused to offer thanks. Neither of them were "sons of Israel." Naaman at first tried to give the prophet Elisha a gift to show his gratitude, which Elisha refused.

Both Naaman and the Samaritan in the Gospel realized that the power of the God of Israel had freed them, not only from their physical suffering, but also from the isolation and fear that went along with it. For that they were truly grateful and said so.

Living Stewardship Now

La misericordia di Gesù verso colui che non possiede altro chela sua povertà e il suo peccato, ma che si volge verso il Signore per trovare il perdono e la riconciliazione, non è solo fonte di salvezza personale, ma anche di reintegrazione nella comunità di culto del popolo di Dio. Nella Chiesa, la fede di coloro che sono stati riscattati diventa azione di grazie al Padre per mezzo di nostro Signore Gesù Cristo (cf. Col 3,16-17).

En las lecturas de hoy algunos leprosos son curados: uno por medio del profeta Eliseo y diez por Jesús. Durante siglos los leprosos eran parias de la sociedad, marginados y obligados a vivir aparte junto a otros afligidos por la misma enfermedad. La muerte no era inminente para los leprosos, por eso la soledad y el hambre eran peor que la enfermedad. Sobrevivían mendigando. Imagínate la alegría de estos leprosos al verse limpios y poder regresar a su vida normal. Sólo dos de estos leprosos se detuvieron a dar gracias. Ninguno de ellos era “hijo de Israel”. Naamán trató primero de hacerle un regalo al profeta como muestra de agradecimiento, lo cual rechazó Eliseo.

Tanto Naamán como el samaritano del evangelio se dieron cuenta de que el poder del Dios de Israel los había librado no sólo del sufrimiento físico, sino también de la soledad y del temor que traen consigo tal enfermedad. Por eso estaban tan agradecidos y así lo expresaron.
