This week a reputable organization called "Pew Research" released its findings about religious practice in the United States. Some activist atheist groups, like the "Secular Coalition", showed delight that, according to the study, more and more people now identify themselves as "atheists" or "agnostics". The Pew study reported that today 3% of Americans self-identify as atheists and 4% as agnostics. But, unlike the activist atheists, I was actually surprised by what a SMALL group of Americans say they don't believe in God or aren't sure. Let's look at it from the reverse angle. To think that 93% of Americans believe in the existence of God, and are willing to say so to a pollster, is truly amazing. Try getting 93% of Americans to agree about anything else! Of course, this does not mean that all believers are practicing their faith. In fact, the same Pew study showed that more and more people are also unaffiliated with any church or denomination. What this tells me is that there are MANY people in our neighborhood who believe deeply in God but who are not coming to our parish or any church.
