Let's all go out of our way to reach out to the elderly in these weeks. Ask them if they would like a visit from one of our priests or sisters. Find out if they need any material assistance. Ask them if they need help getting groceries or getting to the doctor. Then call our parish office and our office staff will help coordinate whatever we can do for them.
